

2012 SECOND SEMESTER ELECTORAL JUSTICE MAGAZINE

The Electoral Court of the Federal Judicial Branch (hereafter TEPJF) invites researchers, professors as well as national and international specialized general public to submit research papers to be included in the 10th issue of the *Justicia Electoral* magazine. Such contributions will be published in the sections "Doctrinal", "Estados", "Documental" and "Bibliográfica" according to the following:

BASES

- The contributions must be written in Spanish, unpublished and not being submitted for assessment for publishing elsewhere. They must be the result or advance of leading original research within the frame of political electoral topics.
- For the case of the sections "Doctrinal" and "Estados", length must range between 15 and 25 pages, including research references. For the section "Bibliográfica", length must range between 3 and 6 pages.
- They must have a brief summary of the author's resume including postal code, attachment, institution and an email address.
- They must contain an abstract in Spanish and English (maximum length of 150 words) and a list of 4 to 6 keywords, written in Spanish and English as well.
- All contributions must be sent to justicia.electoral@te.gob.mx.

The deadline for receiving contributions is **Friday the 11th of May of 2012**. No contribution must be submitted to other magazines since this date and during the assessment process.

Contributions lacking any of the above mentioned criteria will be rejected. All contributions will be subject to assessment before the Academic and Editorial Board of the TEPJF taking into account independently topic relevance as well as academic and formal contents.

The results of the assessment process will not be open to appeal and will be made public on August of 2012.

Besides the above mentioned requisites, contributions must fulfill the following format requirements:

- Single line spacing, 12 dots Univers type, justified aligning, indentation of 1 cm. on the first line and no spaces between paragraphs.
- For the case of texts containing graphs, frames or maps, these must be accompanied by the source and the writable file (Excel, Word, Etc. format).
- Quotes must use Harvard system. Example: (Sartori, 2003; 14).

- Notes must be footnotes in the same page and must be written with single line spacing and have sequential progressive numbering.
- Full bibliographic references must be alphabetically ordered at the end of the text. Its parts must be separated by commas in the following sequence: author or authors (last name and name), year of edition, name of the work in italics, volume, printing place, editor or institution, edition number (after the first edition). Example: Sartori, Giovanni. 1999. *Elementos de Teoría Política*, Madrid: Alianza Editorial, 1^a. Edición.

- When using acronyms and abbreviations for the first time, they must have a full equivalence and then the acronym or abbreviation used thereafter between parentheses.

Authors of all contributions for the magazine that result in a positive assessment, accept the terms stated in this document, as well as permission to TEPJF to publish them in its website, collections, reprints and any other means that allow their broader and better diffusion.
