### Justice Mónica Aralí Soto Fregoso



She has served as a Justice of the High Chamber of the Electoral Tribunal of the Federal Judiciary (TEPJF) since November 2016, and has 25 years of experience in electoral matters, 12 of which have been as a jusdge; she also stands out for protecting the political-electoral rights of women and building criteria that have allowed women to access more elected positions.

### Education

She has a bachelor's degree in Law by the Autonomous University of Guadalajara (UAG), a master's degree in Education and Teaching by the International University of la Paz and is specialized in Electoral Justice and has a diploma in Electoral Law by the High Chamber of the Electoral Tribunal of the Federal Judiciary; as well as a diploma course in Public Policy and Gender, offered by the Latin American Faculty of Social Sciences (FLACSO).

### **Professional Experience**

She has held various positions at the Local Executive Board of the Federal Electoral Institute (then IFE, now INE, in Spanish) in the state of Baja California, Jalisco and Campeche, between 1994 and 2007. In 2007, she was appointed by the State Congress of Baja California as Justice of the State Electoral Tribunal of Baja California. In March 2013, she was appointed Justice of the Regional Chamber of Guadalajara of the TEPJF, in which she was the first female president, until March of 2016.

By proposal of the Supreme Court of Justice, the Mexican Senate elected her Justice of the High Chamber of the Electoral Tribunal of Mexico, for a nine-year period, starting his office on November 4, 2016.

### Chief Justice Reyes Rodríguez Mondragón



### Education

He holds a law degree from Autonomous Technical Institute of Mexico (ITAM) and continued his postgraduate studies at Center for Economic Research and Teaching (CIDE), where he obtained a master's degree in Administration and Public Policy, and later graduated with a Master's degree in Law and Society at the International Institute for the Sociology of Law.

### **Professional activity**

He has been a professor at different institutions and was director of the law program at CIDE. He is the author of several articles and academic publications. In his professional career, he has held various positions in the three branches of government, as well as in autonomous bodies, including the Presidency and the Senate of the Republic, the Ministry of the Interior, the Supreme Court of Justice of the Nation, and the Federal Electoral Institute.

He was an electoral Justice in the Monterrey Regional Chamber from March 2013 to November 2016 and since the end of November 2016 he has been a Justice in the High Chamber of the Electoral Tribunal of the Federal Judiciary. In both positions he has worked for an open justice by promoting and implementing a new model of rulings that are accessible to citizens, using more didactic media (such as infographics) and training on the subject to various officials of the electoral authorities throughout the republic.

On the 2<sup>nd</sup> September 2021, he was appointed as Chief Justice of the TEPJF, with a term of office until October 2024.




